PAST, BUT NOT FORGOTTEN WORSHIPFUL MASTER John R. "Jack" Capra PM-2013

My Brothers,



Each of us, having been found worthy, have had the hallowed rights of the first 3 degrees of Freemasonry bestowed upon us. This was neither a minor decision on our parts, nor that of the Craft. Rather, it was taken by us as a sacred obligation, one with the expectations that our lives would be enriched by the vast histories and mysteries that the Craft had to offer, and to lead us on the path of improving our lives and citizenship. Remember also that the bond is reciprocal, we were not chosen by fate or happenstance, but rather for the character and maturity that we showed when this remarkable invitation was extended to us. In my case my acceptance into the Craft has been beyond anything I could have imagined.

I was Initiated, Passed, and Raised at Solomon Lodge No. 20 in the fall of 2007. I had already been put on alert that I would be going back on active duty and serve my 3rd tour in Iraq with the Navy Reserves in early 2008. The brothers, and especially the Worshipful Master at the time, arranged to have the first 3 degrees awarded to me and help me study and pass my catechisms before the end of the year and in time for me to re-deploy to Baghdad. It was while working at the U.S. Embassy in Iraq that I first discovered how far the network

of my new Masonic brethren extended. While working in the Court translation office an older Iraqi gentleman saw my shiny new Masonic ring and approached me. With tears of joy in his eyes, he told me how he became a Mason years ago, but the Saddam Hussain regime had outlawed all secret organizations so on pain of torture and death he had never admitted to a soul that he was a Mason, not even to his wife of many years. It was a very moving experience for me, not only as a Mason, but also as an American.

In 2012 I became Junior Warden, but near the end of that year of service the Senior Warden announced his intention to relocate and so I was elected to the position of Worshipful Master for the 2013 term. From the very start I was overwhelmed, but the brothers were always there to assist in anything that I needed. That year the brothers voted on a major capital improvement to the Lodge, the badly needed repairs to the front balcony, which was not safe at that time to even walk on. I regret we could not muster the funds to re-roof the Lodge, but that will happen eventually. It was also during my term that we had a great year for membership, as we brought several new members into the Craft. The most meaningful to me was gaining the Grand Lodge's approval to hold a one-day 3-degree ceremony for 3 U.S. Navy Sailors how were deploying out of Mayport Naval Station, Jacksonville. It was more or less an all-day affair for three new Mason's who were about to deploy for several months.

Since being Raised at Solomon Lodge 15 years ago (actually, it was out at Brother Fitzhugh Powell's hunting cabin where I was attacked by red fire ants as I was waiting), I have had an unbelievable journey in the Craft. I have since left the Jacksonville area, but I joined first Ashlar Lodge No. 98 in St. Augustine, Florida, and presently am also a plural member with Jackson Lodge No. 1, Tallahassee, Florida. I have also become a member in both the Scottish Rite as well as the York Rite. But the greatest honor I have had, so far, in Masonry was when my Blue Lodge brothers and peers elected me to serve in the East for that wonderful year.


